CARTER, C. J.

This appeal arises from the divorce proceedings of Donna Glass and David Voiron. After filing for divorce, the parties entered a consent judgment relating to certain community obligations. Thereafter, Glass filed a rule for contempt alleging that Voiron was in violation of the consent judgment in several regards. After an evidentiary hearing, the trial court concurred and rendered the judgment before us on appeal. Voiron has appealed urging multiple assignments of error relating to the procedure used, the evidence presented, and the amount of attorney's fees awarded.

After thorough review, we find no error in the trial court's judgment. This was clearly a contempt proceeding, not a community property partition as Voiron alleges. The community property partition is still pending before the trial court. Thus, there was no error with regard to the procedure employed by the trial court. Further, the record supports the trial court's judgment with regard to amounts Voiron was ordered to pay. Finally, we find no error or abuse of discretion with regard to the attorney's fee Voiron was ordered to pay.

The judgment of the trial court is affirmed. This memorandum opinion is issued in compliance with URCA Rule 2-16.1A(4), (6) and (8). Costs of this appeal are assessed to David Louis Voiron.
