CARTER, C.J.

Plaintiff/Appellant, inmate Derick F. Long, seeks review of the district court judgment dismissing Long's petition for judicial review without prejudice. Case law precedent and statutory authority clearly control the disposition of this case, and the issues raised involve no more than an application of well-settled rules to recurring fact situations. The Commissioner's August 23, 2005, report, adopted by the district court in its September 12, 2005, judgment, thoroughly and adequately discusses the factual and procedural background and provides an excellent analysis of the applicable law.

Accordingly, we affirm the district court's judgment by summary opinion in accordance with Rule 2-16.2A(2), (4), (5), and (6) of the Uniform Rules of Louisiana Courts of Appeal. All costs of this appeal are assessed to the plaintiff/appellant, Derick F. Long.

AFFIRMED.
