General Zoom Information

- In addition to becoming familiar with the Zoom software, it is important to test the computer, audio, video, and internet connection technology you will use during the oral argument.
- For the best audio and video quality use a desktop or laptop computer with a built-in or external USB webcam with microphone, rather than a tablet or mobile phone. Some users prefer the audio quality achieved using headphones, headsets, or earbuds with built-in microphones. Whatever equipment you choose to use, test the equipment in the same location and under the same conditions that you will encounter during oral argument.
- Another important consideration is your location during the oral argument. Find a quiet, protected place where audio and visual interruptions are minimized or eliminated. Light sources should be positioned in front of you to illuminate your face. Light sources behind you will place your face in shadows.
- Dress professionally as if you are appearing before the court in-person. Check your background to see if there is anything distracting, out of place, or unprofessional. The court offers courtroom images on its website to use as a virtual background.
- Zoom displays your name in the lower left-hand corner of the video frame. It is helpful to use the counsel of record name for identification purposes. (For desktops and laptops, you may be able to "right click" on your name to make adjustments to the display name.)

**IN RE: ORAL ARGUMENT VIA VIDEOCONFERENCE**

---

**ORDER**

**WHEREAS**, the Governor of Louisiana in his Proclamation 25 JBE 2020 of March 11, 2020 did declare a public health emergency;

**WHEREAS**, the Supreme Court of Louisiana in its Order of March 16, 2020 did urge all Courts of Louisiana to utilize teleconferencing and videoconferencing technologies;

**WHEREAS**, the Louisiana Court of Appeal, First Circuit did implement videoconferencing technology for oral argument;

**IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that attorneys participating in oral argument via videoconferencing shall, not less than three days prior to the scheduled date of oral argument, notify the Court of all individuals who will attend oral argument via videoconferencing;

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that all participants in oral arguments shall use profiles that identify the participant's name. No participant shall participate anonymously;

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that any recording of oral argument by audio, video, transcription, or by any other means is strictly prohibited and is punishable by contempt of court;

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that attorneys shall notify the court of all individuals who will attend oral arguments. Attorneys shall notify the court at least 48 hours in advance of any changes in oral argument participants; and

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that all participants in oral arguments shall be properly attired in the same manner as would be expected for in-person oral arguments before the court.
